

a) What is the pattern rule?

Dear Grade 3 Families,

We also did a Halloween theme Math activity, where students had to heal Mr. Crankenstein by solving word problems (addition and subtraction). Once they figured out the problem, they had to find the answer on a band aid and stick it onto Mr. Crankenstein. Thank-you to those parents who were able to come and join us for the afternoon.



This week: In **Language Arts**, we continue to work on reading comprehension strategies and our weekly word work to go along with our spelling words. We also have done some Remembrance Day activities. There will be no spelling test on November 20th (when we return from Fall Break). Our next test will be on November 27th.

In **Science**, we have started our Hearing and Sound Unit. We have conducted a few experiments. One consisted of us seeing if changing the length of a ruler (holding it off our desks) would change the pitch. We also tested different sizes of tuning forks to see if there was a difference in the sound they made. You can ask your child what they found out!

In **Social**, we continued to discuss about working together and what that looks like in different countries. We looked at how leaders are chosen in India and compared it to what it's like in Canada. We also wrote some persuasive paragraphs. A community in India had an issue with some members wanting to cut down a tree and some wanting to save it. The students had to choose which side they were on and give reasons why they believed their choice was correct.
